Howdy St John's Congregation,

Did you know that May is Mental Health Awareness Month? There are millions of people worldwide who live with mental illness, and it is in this month that we are called to educate people about mental illness and work together to fight the stigma surrounding this struggle! If you visit the official website for the National Alliance on Mental Illness ([www.nami.org](http://www.nami.org)) you can find more information, resources, and testimonies, and even share your own story!

Data and statistics from the CDC show how drastically experiences of depression and anxiety have increased in our youth over the last 20 years. These numbers spiked even higher during the COVID pandemic. It can be challenging to know how to support people *at any age* with mental illness; one of the first steps is normalizing the fact that ***it is okay to not be okay!*** Even in 2022 there still exists the stigma that to be struggling with mental health is wrong or bad in some way. The fear of being judged can in many cases prevent people from seeking treatment or seeking the support that they need. But the fact is that we are stronger together! 1 Corinthians 12:24 reminds us that, "The body is not supported by one person, but by all of us." We are one; we are strongest working together in unity.

We are called to get educated and support one another, and, most important, to love! The United Church of Christ Mental Health Network has developed a curriculum to help guide congregations on how to become safe spaces for people struggling with mental health by becoming a WISE Congregation. What is a WISE Congregation? "A WISE Congregation has joined the mission to being Welcoming, Inclusive, Supportive, and Engaged in the Mental Health of the community and the wider world." If you would like to join me in the work to make St. John's UCC a WISE congregation, please reach out to me!

It is okay to not be okay, and it is always okay to ask for help! Christ is with you, your friends at St. John's are ready to support you, and I'm always happy to lend a hand or an ear. One of the strongest things a person can do is ask for help!

### **Our Partnership with Central Elementary School**

This is the first time in three years that there has been a full year of in-person education inside the school building at 829 West Turner Street, here in Allentown...the first time in three years that each and every classroom (and nook and cranny tucked away here and there) has been overflowing with “littles”, as the staff affectionately calls them...the first time in three years that the school has come to life with the energy, the ginormous snap, crackle, and pop of nearly 800 children’s voices...and there’s what you don’t hear -- the quiet voices and listening ears taking it all in.

It’s a new day at Central Elementary School. Is it back to normal? Who’s to say what “normal” is? Is this the “new normal”? Perhaps until tomorrow. There’s a comfort found in being back in a routine of classes, of being together as a class with its teacher, of movement from one activity to another. However, underscoring every minute of each new day is the daunting challenge of overcoming gaps in the students’ education, gaps formed during the pandemic and left behind for the teachers to conquer, much like climbing mountains and valleys left by earthquakes, volcanic activity, and major shifts in the earth’s surface over millenia.

Never underestimate the tenacity of a teacher! That’s the good news! Central’s teachers and administration have always been committed to achieving a strong academic program and have the drive, the ingenuity, and the patience to provide just that.

Did you know that Central hosts LIVE bedtime stories on their website or Facebook page every Monday at 7pm? This week, Superintendent Stanford read “Imagine” by Juan Felipe Herrera.

We will begin our offerings of school uniforms during the last two weeks of May and continue through June and July. Information about the different types of uniforms for girls and for boys and the cost of each will be forthcoming.
