Howdy St. John's Family,

This year my pastoral letters each focus on a different letter from the New Testament as we explore what happens after the Gospels and the book of Acts. This month we are looking at Galatians! Paul wrote this letter to a number of churches in the region of Galatia; we know he had a personal connection with these churches because his missionary journey is documented in the book of Acts. This letter is a really great example of the early church figuring out what it meant to *be the church*. Although Jesus was Jewish, by the time that Paul was writing this letter, there were just as many non-Jewish Christians as there were Jewish Christians. This was a good thing! But it did spark some debate among the communities, the biggest question of which was, "did the early Christians need to convert first to Judaism?" This is where the letter to the Galatians comes in, because Paul needed this community to understand that the good news of salvation through Jesus was for **all** people!

In the first two chapters of Galatians, Paul provides an overview and summary of the Gospel message. One of the main arguments from these Jewish Christians was that if people weren't adhering to the laws of the Torah and becoming circumcised, they weren't really following the faith. In chapter two, verse sixteen, Paul says, "people are not justified by the works of the Torah, but rather by the faith of Jesus the Messiah, and we have faith in the Messiah Jesus!". *Justified* is a really important word in the Torah, because it means that you are "declared righteous" and in a right-relationship with God. Chapters three through four talk about who is included in this new holy family under Christ's death and resurrection (spoiler alert: it's all of us!). This promise of being part of God's holy family may have started with Abraham, but through the sacrifice of Christ, everyone who accepts this gift of salvation is made a part of God's holy family! The circle widens and we are all welcome as children of the king!

This would satisfy a number of people, but Paul knew that it would not satisfy the dissenters who firmly believed Christians must first convert to Judaism. That's why in chapters five through six, Paul explains that it is through the transformational power of the Holy Spirit that people will learn to live out the law. When Jesus was asked what the most important law is, he explained that it was to love the Lord your God, and to love your neighbor as yourself. Humans may not be able to overcome the things that lead to death on their own, but Jesus did! When we live Christ-centered lives, they begin to reflect that light onto the world, and the result is what Paul calls, "the fruits of the spirit". This will help us to become people of joy,

love, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control. Just like real fruit, we need to cultivate it, and stay committed to it. I pray that this has encouraged you to cultivate these fruits of the Spirit and be blessed! -Pastor Becky Sausser

Consistory Summary

The Consistory meeting held on March 12, 2024, began promptly at 7pm. We opened with a time of joys and concerns and then reviewed the minutes from the February 15 meeting. The minutes were approved. Under Christian Ed, Pastor Becky reported that the youth Sunday date will be announced soon, and that the confirmation class was working on their community service project. The Personnel Committee reported that they had a successful annual meeting with Lois, Becky, and Andrea. Under the Green Team committee, it was shared that Rick will be preaching an Earth Day sermon on April 21, and it was shared that we would like to encourage everyone to attend the April 7 potluck event. Under old business it was shared that as soon as the final estimates are compiled, the people interested in participating in the capital improvements discussion will meet. There was no new business. After the prayer call, a prayer chain is generated and sent out to folks who have requested to receive it. The only information written is that which the participants have agreed to have shared.


