On Christmas Eve, our Special Mission Offering will go exclusively to the Christmas Fund. This is one of the Five Designated Mission Offerings of the UCC. Its purpose, as with the Curtis Fund, is to meet unexpected financial needs of retired UCC clergy who, because of their employment histories, have insufficient pensions to meet their needs. In this season, when home and family are so important, these offerings focus on helping our Church family to meet their needs throughout the year.
